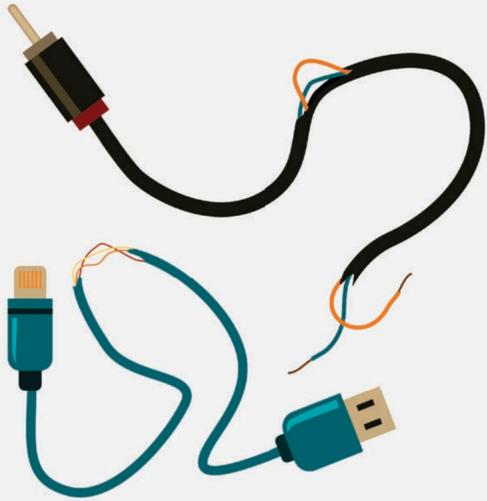




Prevent Burns & Fires at Home



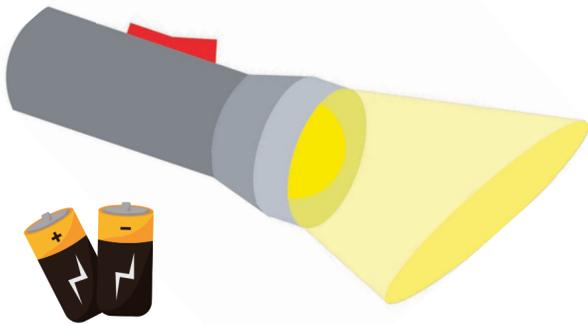
Avoid using electrical cords that are broken or frayed. Keep cords safe and out of reach.



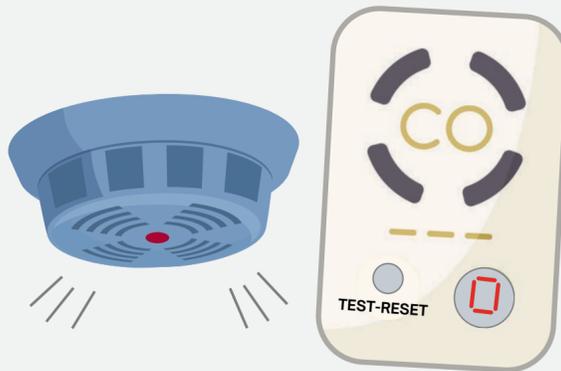
Do not overload your outlets. Call an electrician if your outlet is warm, discolored, or sparks.



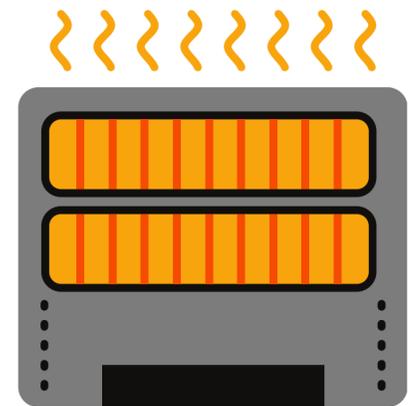
Watch your food while cooking. Turn pot handles towards the back of the stove to help prevent burns.



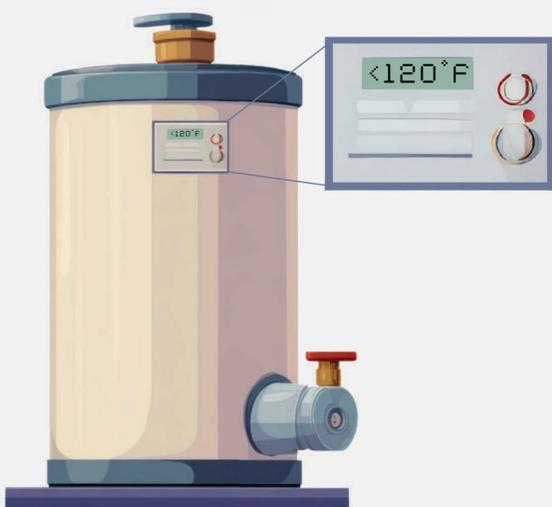
Blow out candles when you leave the room or go to bed. Flashlights are a safer choice when the power goes out.



Test your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors regularly according to manufacturer instructions.



Keep anything that could burn at least 3 feet away from heat sources.



Set your water heater to no more than 120°F to help prevent scalds.



Put out fires before going to sleep or leaving your home.



Make an emergency plan and practice it often with all members of the household.
