

Safety Sami Says: Have a plan to escape in case of emergency!

Here are a few helpful hints when designing your family's escape plan:

- Make your plan large and easy for everyone to read.
- Make sure your plan includes each level and every room in your home.
- Identify safe places in your home for different emergencies (i.e. an interior room or basement for a tornado).
- Identify a meeting place outside of the home for the entire family to meet in case of a fire or other emergency and mark it on your plan.
- Mark two exits (a door and a window) from each room in your home in case one exit is blocked.

- Draw a path from each room to the safe places and meeting place.
- Include local emergency phone numbers on your plan.
- Practice your emergency evacuation plan at least twice a year.
- Post your emergency evacuation plan somewhere in your home where everyone can see it.
- Take a picture of the meeting place and post it in your room or on the refrigerator to help everyone remember the meeting place.
